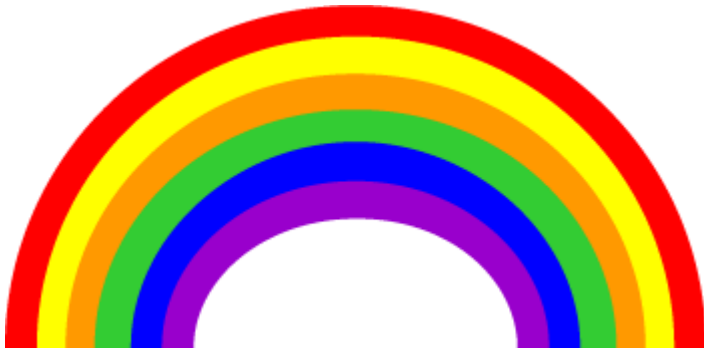

## Children @ St. James

### Sundays at the 10:30 service

From September to June, and visitors are ALWAYS welcome! During the summer months there is an activity centre set up at the back of the church.

**Church School** classes for children ages 3 & up

Children gather with the congregation at the beginning of the service, and then go to Church School, returning at the time of the Offering Hymn. Parents of children in the Nursery are asked to pick up their children at the time of the Offertory Hymn, so we can all be gathered together for the Eucharist.

All baptized children, regardless of age, are encouraged to receive communion. If you have questions about your child receiving communion, please speak with one of the clergy.

There are also other Christian education opportunities throughout the year ~ Perth Deanery (regional) Holy Days, the *Life in the Eucharist* programme during Lent, the "Walk with Jesus" Stations of the Cross on Good Friday.

And..... we have some terrific and FUN events planned like the Christmas Pageant, the Angel Party, the Mardi Gas Parade and Pancake Party, and the Parish Picnic.....even a Family Dance Beach Party scheduled for February 2010!!

## Sunday Offering

As Christians, and as members of a Christian community, we are called to share our "Time, Talent & Treasure" ~ our contribution towards the ministry of the church and the building of God's Kingdom. How we manage our time, talent and treasure is called "stewardship". Each Sunday the children and youth are invited to bring a money offering to church. The Church School teachers decide month by month where the offering will go, and we use this as a teaching opportunity. For example, last year the Church School contributed to the St. James' Food Bank, the Huron Hunger Fund, the Perth County SPCA, and the St. James' winter heating bill.

## Parenting in the Pew

It's not always easy for parents with small children in church. Please know that any noise usually sounds much louder to the parents than it does to anyone in the church! Here are some - hopefully - helpful tips:

- Children like to see what going on.....so try sitting a bit closer to the front.
- If your child is reading, or beginning to read, help them to follow along with the service. All the congregational parts of the service - except the hymns - are in the Sunday bulletin.
- Encourage them to sing, and sing along with them!
- There is an activity table at the back of the church. Young children are invited to use this table before the service, and once communion has started.
- Bring a small selection of "church toys/books" that are reserved for Sundays only.
- Stay for fellowship time after the service.

## Receiving Communion and the H1N1 Virus

Since the SARS crisis a few years ago, the Diocese of Huron established a pandemic preparedness task force, which developed a pandemic protocol for the diocese. This past spring, our Diocesan Bishop Robert Bennett sent a letter to all parishes stating that, **in light of concerns related to the spread of the H1N1 virus, the practice of intinction - dipping the bread into the wine - is to be suspended.** Intinction actually poses a greater health risk than sipping from the common cup. When your children come for communion they may receive the bread and sip from the cup OR they may receive the bread alone, which is considered a full communion.
