Michael Wood's note about today's musicians

Today's ensemble comes to us from four decades of performance venues throughout Ontario and Alberta. Our guitarist Ralf Bushmever was first introduced to me in Calgarv when I had the opportunity to hire him for three days of high school clinics in the Rocky View School System, sponsored by Yamaha Music Canada. Jay Boehmer on drums, came into my life through our work with the Ontario Chapter of the Percussive Arts Society, and bassist Darryl Stacey has been on my first call list since our introduction in the London Club Scene when I moved to Stratford in 1980. All share a commitment to academia. Ralf has taught at St. Ambrose University (Calgary Alberta), Selkirk University (Nelson BC) and is presently teaching at Heritage College in Cambridge. Jay Boehmer has an active private studio and is frequently called to coach in the Peel District School Board. Darryl was called to teach at the Thames Valley District School Board and since his retirement has been able to concentrate extensively on his performance jobbing.
